A survey or audit of land is an important benchmark to<br>be completed at this stage.<br>Where a diocese has farming tenants, a diocesan policy on managing<br>land assets should include clear social and environmental aspects,<br>reflecting the fourth and fifth Anglican Marks of Mission. |

## What does an Environmental Policy look like?

An environmental policy will look different in each diocese, but the objective is the same - to guide and shape care for God's creation within the diocese. As with any policy it will need to be regularly reviewed and revised to keep it relevant and practical.

- Norwich Diocese has a simple statement for their <u>environmental policy</u>.
- Truro Diocese has an excellent example of an <u>environmental strategy</u> that is visually attractive and great for sharing their vision more widely.
- Birmingham <u>Environment Policy</u> is presented clearly on their website and embedded into the diocese via a well-thought-out structure and mechanism called the <u>Environment Programme</u>.

## Is an Environmental Policy the same as a Net Zero Action Plan?

An environmental policy is *not* the same as a net zero plan. An environmental policy encompasses a more holistic collection of ideas including ministry training and worship, for example. **Further guidance about land at Silver Eco Diocese level is being developed.**
