

Resources for small groups

Why?

We face a huge environmental crisis. As Christians, we need a biblical framework to help us respond to crises and to continue our walk of faith with perseverance and resilience as we process difficult challenges ourselves and seek to give Christ-centred hope to those around us.

Small groups are places where we can unpack our questions, explore biblical teaching in more detail and share our experiences and encouragement. They may be study groups or perhaps action– focused groups, where working in community is more effective than alone. Groups help us walk an unknown journey in the safety of caring friends who are also seeking to live out a calling as disciples of Christ, with love for others and justice for creation.

How?


Your church may wish to prepare its own studies around this theme in a way which is appropriate to your context. However, if you want to take advantage of publicly available resources (which can of course be customised), here are a few suggestions:

Bible studies

'Joy in Enough. The Plenty! Course' is a timely course covering the way our economic and social systems influence our behaviour which is damaging to the environment and the climate, and to humankind. Produced by Green Christian, the issues are discussed in a scriptural context, and participants are encouraged to think about what the Bible encourages us to do differently: joyinenough.org/resources/plenty/







Resources for small groups

The Bible Reading Fellowship produced two bible-based books in 2021 to unpack bible pages and show their relevance to environmentalism:

- 'A Christian Guide to Environmental Issues' by Margot and Martin Hodson. 

'*Doxology*' offers a study guide designed to be used for both personal reflection and small group discussion, with questions provided at the end of each chapter.
